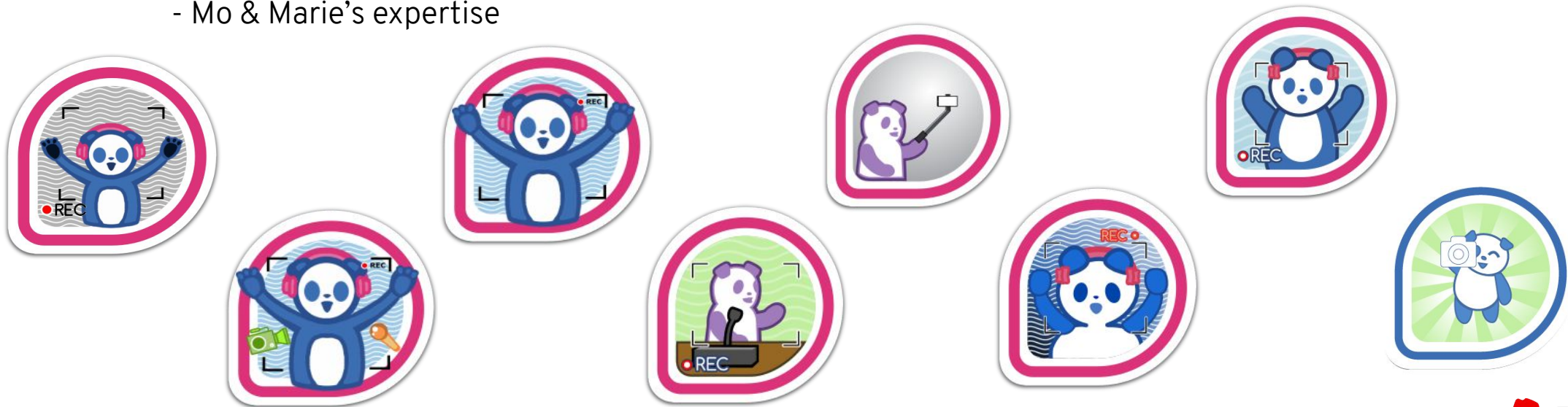

- Waterfall method

Answering Interview Questions

Tldr; Spend <3 minutes on each question and be engaging!

Best Answering Practices

- Start and end your answers with a second of silence; it will be edited out
- Avoid spending too much time on questions to keep the video engaging
 - Keep it to 2 minutes max on a question
- Pick and choose questions that you feel would be most interesting or you are more comfortable sharing
- Feel free to re-record any answer until you're happy with it

Recording Yourself

Tldr; Answer each question in a separate video, make sure the audio/video quality are as high as possible, and send a thumbnail picture!

What do you think is the future of Fedora and any suggestions on how we can reach it?

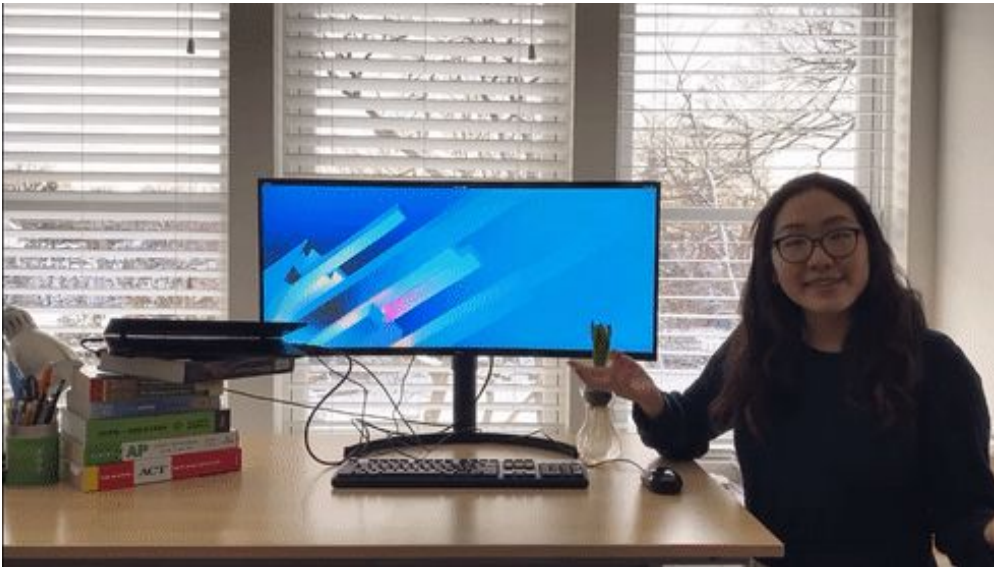

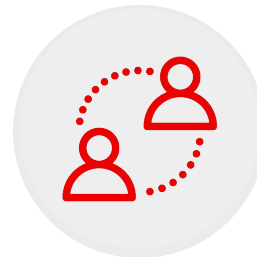
